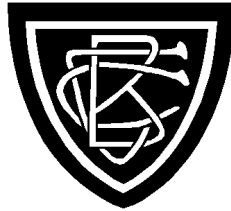

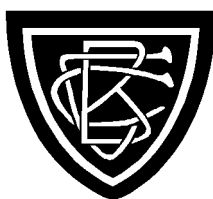

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

Presented to members and visitors at Hotel Kew on Thursday the 28th of July 2011.

The Board of Management of the Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated presents for adoption the 91st Annual Report & Associated Statements of accounts for season 2010-11.

In season 2010-11, Balwyn Cricket Club fielded four senior teams in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA) and five junior teams in the Eastern Cricket Association (ECA).

The 1st and 2nd XI's played in the North/South group and both finished the season in ninth position on the ladder. In a season affected badly by inclement weather – with most clubs struggling to build much momentum – Balwyn's top two sides were both well placed leading into the Christmas break but struggled to maintain this performance into 2011. The 3rd and 4th XI's played in the North group, with the 4th XI again frustrated by unavailability and an ever-changing XI and just missing finals. The 3rd XI carried the Club's hopes in finals, achieving the milestone for the sixth successive year after finishing the regular season in 4th position. Despite having Brunswick 7/49 in reply on the second day of the semi-final (following a haul of 6/21 from Tristan Harding), unfortunately their season ended when the rain set in again.

Season 2010-11 was captain-coach Ben Hanley's second season at Balwyn. Ben personally had a successful year, scoring 344 runs. In addition, a number of players throughout the club had career best years and definitely benefited from increased opportunities they were provided with. In particular Nick Hailey (in his first year at the Club), Patrick Tuohey, Ben McLeod, Andrew Walpole, Travis Miles and Michael Tuohey formed the nucleus of an at times well performed 1st XI.

Ben Hanley and his Match Day Committee comprising Mark Gordon and the respective grade captains ensured we were competitive and well prepared throughout the senior sides. The spread of results across the senior sides saw that Balwyn was to finish sixteenth (of 28) in the VSDCA club championship which unfortunately represented a drop of five places from the previous season. Once again, we thank long time Match Committee chairman Mark Gordon who again fulfilled a very important role. Mark has indicated that he wishes to step down from this role in season 2011-12. His leadership, practical attitude and infectious sense of humour will be greatly missed – although he assures us that he will not be a stranger to the Club!

In season 2011-12 the VSDCA will require all clubs to have at least one designated 'Club Umpire' to officiate in home matches of the 3rd and 4th XI. In anticipation of this edict, we were delighted to welcome Ken McNiece to the club to fill the role of Club Umpire for season 2010-11. Ken is a highly competent, entertaining, and well respected member of the Club and his presence at training and on match days (whether officiating or not) was greatly appreciated. Ken also supported all of the Club's social functions and was a much deserving recipient of this year's Best Clubman award. We hope to enjoy Ken's presence around the Club next year. We also thank Brett Oliver for acting as a club umpire when injured during part of this year.

The club this year fielded five junior sides. The organisation of this vital component of the club continues to be undertaken by Brendan Moore. In his very dry and understated manner he gives this very important part of the club much needed structure and is immensely popular for the manner in which he meets the challenges of managing a transient group of players and parents. To those parents that were involved in coaching or other match day contributions we welcome your contributions, thank you for your assistance and interest, and hope that ultimately it will translate in to watching your kids and their friends become senior players at Balwyn Cricket Club.

The aspect of managing the coaching of junior players is always a vexing one, particularly as it often requires a degree of flexibility to assist with early afternoons training sessions and the like. To that end we were fortunate enough to again enjoy the assistance of Daniel Kiely and his team – including Tristan Harding, Tom Harley, Jacob Jacob and Pat O'Brien. As always the assistance of other senior players would be further welcomed. It was very encouraging to see the work they put in and the feedback we received reflected very well on their contributions.

Another very important aspect of our junior structure is the In2Cricket (formerly Milo) program. This year we had over 50 registrations and Elizabeth Orr is again a source of great inspiration for the manner in which she continues to serve the club in the capacity as the In2Cricket co-ordinator. The only slightly disappointing aspect of the program was the loss of some of the participants when it is time to graduate to junior cricket to rival junior clubs who do not offer such programs.

The RM Hatch Under 15 representative squad was again managed by John Farmer and Elizabeth Orr who have been a perennial presence in the running of this side for a number of years. This year they also had the assistance of current player Brett Oliver. As a club we have adopted the approach of selecting local players

with a view to having them become potential senior players in years to come. The results this season were very good even if there was an element of disappointment in not finishing higher. Unfortunately the inclement weather that marred much of the season also affected the Hatch boys' progress. Washouts and a couple of losses up-front unfortunately meant that they would not progress to finals. However, to their credit they finished strongly winning their last three matches against Kew, Ivanhoe and Preston. As always it is to be hoped the exposure given to those selected over the fortnight in early January should be of benefit in years to come. A number of players selected in this side represented the club at senior level during the season, including Will Houston, Daniel Speake, Daniel Clarke, Lachlan Johnston, Nick Stragalinos, Andrew Padbury and Dominic Greene. John Farmer's continued involvement as RM Hatch manager is much appreciated by both the participants, their families and the wider community.

The club's financial outcome for 2010-11 was covered off in some depth by our Honorary Treasurer Damian Boland in his very insightful report. We are indebted not only to his financial acumen, but also his hard work in ensuring all challenges related to our financial wellbeing are covered off. Financially however challenges continue to remain and we as a board are committed in ensuring that we are well placed to meet them. That Damian devotes so much time to not only the financial aspects but also the more mundane and little noticed things, is a tribute to the respect he has for his cricket club and those that comprise it. With Damian at the helm we are confident that the interests of the club and its financial wellbeing are being addressed in a very professional and forthright manner.

Our relationship with the VSDCA this season was administered in an effective and positive manner. In particular we offer our thanks to the Secretary Ken Hilton and his assistant Peter Flack. Ken in particular is very quick to address any correspondence or queries we may have and administers the competition in a professional and friendly fashion.

Our President James Sheehan has just completed his second season on the VSDCA Executive. This is not only a fine reflection of James' abilities, but also is an acknowledgement of the manner in which the Club has been administered over recent times. With regard to the VSDCA, we are very well represented by our Club Delegates which was also of immeasurable assistance. We continue to lobby vigorously regarding the vexing issue of where our lower XI's are grouped and we await the fixture beyond this year and trust that the competition deals with this matter in a fair and just manner rather than ceding to the interests of certain clubs who do not get saddled with the travel burden that we find ourselves suffering from.

We are indebted to the VSDCA's major sponsor Kookaburra for their support by way of stumps, match balls and promotional material. Season 2010-11 saw the continuation of the Primary Edge Twenty20 Cup competition. The format saw the club's 1st XI play three Tuesday evening games of which we won all three, making it to the semi-finals where the side unluckily lost to Melton. We were delighted to welcome Peter Dickson back to the club for these fixtures (Peter is currently playing Premier Cricket with Fitzroy-Doncaster) and also a cameo from Daniel Harford (former Hawthorn / Carlton AFL player).

We also again hosted two games of the annual country week competition and we trust that the players representing Warrnambool, Leongatha, Shepparton and Albury Wodonga enjoyed our facilities. With respect to the wider game, the Club empathises with the many challenges clubs in regional Victoria and in Queensland faced – and continue to face – as a result of this year's devastating floods. Balwyn Cricket Club again assisted clubs in these areas financially and with packages of cricket gear during the year.

On matters closer to home we again thank the City of Boroondara for their support in facilitating our ability to play cricket throughout both our senior and junior grades. In particular we are thankful for the undertaking of capital works and ground and pavilion improvements which have been happening over the past 12 months. Significantly there have been major pavilion works at Gordon Barnard Reserve with the new pavilion in use this year on the Eastern side of the ground. It is now a significantly improved and impressive venue at which to play cricket. In lieu of the stage 2 development of the upstairs social rooms at Balwyn Park, we were again fortunate enough to avail ourselves of the bowling club rooms for social and post-match functions.

This year also saw the departure of Kirsty Reidy (Sportsground Development Coordinator) and Clare Graham (Sports Liaison Officer) from their roles at the City of Boroondara. We would like to thank Kirsty and Clare for their assistance over the last few years and look forward to working closely with their replacements, David Nankervis and Jo Kennedy.

The maintenance and standards of the turf wickets by which our facility is often judged was overall well regarded. The City of Boroondara in conjunction with Yarra Valley water recognise the role sport plays in the community and as such we have been the beneficiaries of the warm season grass program which added immeasurably to both grounds we utilise. Furthermore additional requests around a flexible fixture or training requirement regarding the facilities were nearly always promptly dealt with and we thank both Clare Graham and Kirsty Reidy for that. We were also pleased at the acknowledgement the VSDCA gave our club with respect to the state of our facilities and the way in which we interact with our local council. This is

certainly a high priority for Cricket Victoria as it seeks to reinforce cricket as the pre-eminent summer sport across the state.

Other Government initiatives saw the club maintain compliance with the Working with Children legislation. The additional impost of the compliance should be seen in the light of the positive outcomes parents should get in the knowledge that those in leadership positions across both the senior and junior sections of the club are fully accredited and understanding of their obligations. In conjunction with the Australian Drug Foundation, the Club also hosted a Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) course at the clubrooms prior to Christmas. This course was promoted by the City of Boroondara and subsequently attended by around twenty participants from sporting clubs in surrounding regions, as well many of our own Committee members. We thank Bill Karametos and Colin Mann for their assistance in organising this course.

At Balwyn Cricket Club we recognise that we have community obligations beyond our sport and to that end we have adopted the 'Good Sports' program. This is a national program that promotes a cultural change in sporting clubs away from the negative effects of alcohol use and towards a community and family focus with an emphasis on respecting the safe licensed venue we have. We hope that this initiative coupled with the practical application of the fundamentals within the program, will encourage all parents to continue to view the Balwyn Cricket Club as the club of choice for their children and their friends. This season we were pleased to achieve stage 3 of our accreditation and trust that this is a reflection of the responsible manner in which both the club and its members conduct themselves.

The contribution of Andrew Walpole and Jake Gordon in managing our sponsors and co-ordinating club functions is also greatly appreciated. Both of these roles go quite some way to ensuring our financial wellbeing, particularly this years' Trivia Night which was one of our most successful in terms of both attendance and money raised. The Presentation Night was again a large logistical undertaking and this year it was held at Hotel Kew.

The Hotel Kew proved to be a fine venue for our monthly committee meetings and we thank Nick and all of our club members who support the Club. We look forward to their ongoing support of the Club next year through their generous sponsorship. In that light, we thank all our Sponsors and in particular the contributions of the Bendigo Bank and the Hotel Kew.

From an administrative perspective, Brett Oliver continued to provide outstanding support to the Club as our MyCricket Coordinator and Membership Secretary. The online MyCricket system provides an excellent platform for entry of scorecards and tracking of clubs' membership and playing statistics. However, it is a time-consuming task to accurately enter match statistics onto the web at the conclusion of matches. If this task is left to many volunteers, the risk of incomplete or inaccurate information is greatly enhanced and we are grateful to Brett for again managing this process. We note the recent vote at the July VSDCA meeting that will require home clubs to input scores from 1st XI fixtures by 9pm after the conclusion of each day's play (or face fines from the association). We feel that the requirement to enter full scorecards and match details in such a short space of time is somewhat onerous on club volunteers. However, as always we will endeavour to meet our administrative responsibilities. We also thank Brett Oliver for compiling this annual report which is one of the most professional reports across the association and is well regarded by the VSDCA executive.

This season saw us continue to maintain contact with former players and it was particularly pleasing that one of our long serving former players and life member in Bud Walder was on hand to present the medal named in his honour to the four joint-winners at the presentation night. We also thank our many past players who contributed to the club through taking up Golden Tiger coterie memberships. It is to be hoped that in years to come that this initiative will be the bridge that keeps our past players actively engaged in the wellbeing of our club. As a club we are always delighted when past players are on hand even if the interaction is sometimes infrequent.

We look forward to the 2011-12 season with much optimism.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The historically high incidence of rain this summer made season 2010/11 one of the more challenging years on field for the Balwyn Cricket Club and turf cricket competitions across Melbourne in general. Despite these on field challenges, the Club managed to generate an operating surplus of \$6,320 – a tremendous result considering the number of Thursday night selection and Saturday 'after matches' which were lost due to rain during the course of the season. The positive profit result once again strengthened the Balwyn Cricket Club's balance sheet, with our net asset position growing by 11% on 2009/10.

Revenues for the Club were down 22% this season, mostly driven by the significant \$11,814 (65%) reduction in Sponsorship and Donations, on the back of the lower number of sponsors involved and grants received versus the prior year. Subscriptions were also down by \$1,815 (17%) on 2009/10, due to a 50% lower social membership base and one less junior team being fielded for the Club this season. The level of Income from Managed Investments also fell by \$1,893 (83%), given the rather 'mixed' year encountered by the local and global markets, particularly over the past 6 months. Conversely, Sale of Inventory was up on the 2009/10 result by \$1,566 (141%), with the coloured clothing costs not being incorporated into the player subs packages this season.

Despite Club revenues being down year over year, it was the reduction in our Operating Expense base which helped to deliver the positive profit result for the Club this season. Inventory and Consumables were down \$3,978 (26%) on the prior year, mainly due to the costs for coloured clothing inflating the 09/10 figure; notwithstanding the substantial stock of red match balls being on hand at the end of this season, given very few 2-day matches were actually completed. Ground Rental and Council Charges reduced by 41% on 2009/10, firstly due to the Club incurring less Turf Wicket charges this season on the back of the lower incidence of training and matches, combined with lower Tenancy charges due to additional 'catch up' tenancy charges being incurred for the Bowls Club in 2009/10.

Congratulations to all of the award winners across all of the senior and junior grades in 2010/11, very well deserved in a challenging and heavily interrupted season. A special mention must be made of our new Club umpire, Ken McNiece, for deservedly taking out the Best Clubman award for the Balwyn Cricket Club in season 2010/11. In addition to his dedicated umpiring duties which were very well received by all at the Club, 'Kenny' was a regular observer on most training nights and a tremendous supporter of Thursday night dinners, 'post match' on Saturdays and all social functions throughout the course of the year. Kenny, thanks for all you did in 2010/11 Kenny and we look forward to having you on board again in 2011/12.

Once again I pass my sincere thanks to President James Sheehan and the Committee of the Balwyn Cricket Club for their leadership, support and advice with matters financial throughout the past season. Thanks also to all of the sponsors, supporters and members of the Balwyn Cricket Club for their on-going and very generous support of our organisation throughout season 2010/11. It is always very much appreciated.

Given the track record of both the economy & environment in recent years, 2011/12 will no doubt bring new and more exotic challenges for the operational effectiveness of the Club. For starters, the looming spectre of the Carbon tax and its requisite impacts will certainly be an interesting one to gauge over the course of the next year. As I do every year though, I implore of all members, sponsors and supporters of the Club to continue to stick together and do everything in their power to take the Club forward once again in 2011/12, no matter what challenges or environment we face into next year.

40 years ago (1970-71)

- The outstanding performer for the season was club stalwart (and current Club Patron) Keith James who became club champion, scored more runs than any other player in the club and won the 1st XI batting award. The Club Patron in 1970/71 was RJ (Dick) Hamer who was later to be Premier of Victoria.
- The 1st XI finished on top of the ladder but were to lose the semi final to the eventual premier Ormond.
- The Ladies Committee raised \$400 following another season of devotion to the social and culinary requirements of the players. The club budgeted wisely and recorded a surplus for the first time in many years.
- The club submitted a proposal to the VSDCA suggesting the Ashes be awarded to the side winning a test series and the Ashes not be awarded if a series is drawn. This was in response to the negative cricket experienced during the recently concluded MCC tour of Australia (For the record England won the series of 2-0).
- The social calendar commenced with a country and western music festival in 'the barn' at Balwyn Park.
- The most improved player was awarded to Mark Gordon.

1ST XI CAPTAIN REPORT

A finish of 9th position (5 wins and 8 losses) after the home and away season was a very disappointing result after much optimism in the pre season and a terrific start to the season. The 6th placed side Brunswick finished three games clear of us on 8 wins so we were a long way from playing finals which I thought was a very realistic goal with a top 6 being introduced this season and the positive way the team finished off the 2009/10 season.

With the loss of club stalwarts Clinton Kennon and David Bennett (retirement) and Mitchell Carey (electing to play at premier level) our depth was going to be tested. These losses were counteracted by Paul Janes returning after a season off, Nick Hailey and Richard Woods as new recruits to the club, Robert O'Hern who returned from a stint at premier club Camberwell Magpies, Stuart Baum decided come out of retirement and make a return and mid season Mitchell Carey decided to come back to Balwyn after deciding premier cricket wasn't for him at this point in his life.

Whilst the season was incredibly unsettled due to unseasonable weather patterns (only 1 x two day game was possible), the lack of stability, consistency in performance and player availability was the most frustrating and disappointing aspect from my point of view as captain.

The team was unsettled for the most part of the season which resulted in us rarely being able to get our best team together and also maintaining the same side from week to week was difficult due to an avalanche of weddings, injuries, work and family commitments and so forth.

The season was delayed until the end of October where we lost a very winnable home game against Ormond. After this loss the team started to hit their straps with some impressive wins against Elsternwick, Plenty Valley, Moorabbin and Ivanhoe which were all achieved batting second which is generally seen as harder than setting a total to defend.

The batting during this period was very good with victories against Elsternwick (by 8 wickets chasing 135), Plenty Valley (7 wickets chasing 190) and Ivanhoe (5 wickets chasing 220). These were all very comfortable and comprehensive victories with Nick Hailey and Ben Hanley generally getting the team off to a great start at the top of the order and the middle order cashing in on the good work at the top. The bowling was up and down during this period, but we always managed to take wickets at crucial times and keep the opposition down to an achievable score. All the bowlers contributed well at various stages with impressive and match winning and consistent performances by Ben McLeod, Paul Janes and Mick Tuohey.

The 3rd victory of the sequence versus Moorabbin was the most difficult and satisfying. We were in all sorts of trouble (5/26 and 7/82) chasing a below par score of 145 until Andrew Walpole dug in and with the support of the lower order and in particular Mitchell Carey to lead the side over the line by 3 wickets with 15 balls left. Andrew finished on 55no while Mitchell more than did his bit with 38no and showed his maturity.

After a terrific victory versus Ivanhoe we were equal top of the ladder coming into our last game before Christmas against Brighton at home. On this occasion we batted first on a difficult wicket after morning rain and only managed 108. After some early wickets Brighton achieved the runs comfortably 5 wickets down with 20 overs to spare.

This was the start of a disappointing period for the team and the batting group in particular where they couldn't get any match winning partnerships going and we achieved below par scores versus Brighton (108 all out), Coburg (132 all out) chasing 145 in a 20/20 game and Malvern an embarrassing 64 all out.

However there were some impressive bowling performances in this period that almost allowed us to sneak over the line and win some / all of these games. The most impressive of these performances was by Mitchell Carey versus the eventual group premier Malvern. Defending a paltry 64 Mitchell charged in and bowled 8 overs of great controlled fast bowling which enabled him to take 5/17 and really show his ability as an extremely promising and talented player. This almost bowled the team to victory as we had Malvern 8/53 at one point in reply. Unfortunately we couldn't grab our opportunities and win the game.

After the loss to Malvern our next game was away against Kew in what loomed as an elimination final type scenario. In outstanding conditions we bowled first and did a brilliant job in restricting Kew to only 156 which was what we thought was a below par score. After losing a couple of early wickets we were in complete control at 2/93 at the half way point. From there was a terrible batting collapse which saw us bowled out for 115 and well short of the target. This was a particularly tough loss to endure and really summed up our season where we regularly seemed to win large chunks of games but then couldn't win the important period which ultimately cost us the game.

In an incredibly tight division we were still in a position to make the finals after this bad run of form. The next weekend saw us have two games in the weekend due to the reserve day which was to decide our destiny. On the Saturday we were at home against Kingston Saints who were one of the poorer sides in the competition. We batted first and made a terrific score of 4/278 off our 45 overs with great contributions by Nick Hailey and Ben Hanley who both just fell short of centuries. This was always going to be too many for Kingston to chase and we managed to take wickets regularly and bowl them out for 141. This game was the start of a terrific period for Pat Tuohey with the ball. Whilst he had been bowling well earlier in the season the wickets weren't coming as I am sure he would have liked. But on this day he managed to take 5/30 which was a terrific effort.

Buoyed by a great victory on Saturday we had our reserve day fixture away against Preston on the Sunday who are always a very challenging and competitive opponent. On a great day and picturesque oval we were dealt a below par and well used wicket which resulted in the ball dominating the bat. We bowled first and were right on top with Preston 7/50 and in trouble. Their lower order fought the rest of the innings out and they managed to scramble to 8/126 which resulted in being too many for us to get and we were bowled out for 88. With our season on the line the batting group couldn't get going in the tough conditions and we fell short in was another game that got away from us.

We finally got the creams out of the cupboard for only time during the season against Caulfield away at their place. On a great wicket and slow outfield we did well on day one to restrict them to 221 with Pat Tuohey and Richard Woods bowling very well against a strong batting line up. The next week we had exactly the same conditions and couldn't withstand some excellent fast bowling and crumbled to 98 all out which would have been even more embarrassing but for Ben McLeod who played a terrific lone hand of 50no.

Our final home and away game was against Brunswick at home who were playing for a spot in the finals. In wonderful conditions we batted first and made a competitive score of 8/186 which proved to be about 20 or 30 runs short as Brunswick achieved the runs with 3 or 4 overs to spare.

Whilst it was a difficult season for a variety of reasons as mentioned earlier, I can't fault the players efforts on a weekend when its game time. We are a very talented squad of players who just need to be mentally stronger and tougher and believe in yourself that you are good enough to play at this level and succeed. I really hope to full fill our ability and show the competition that we can be a force.

I look forward to next season and I hope we are all hurting from the missed opportunities from last season and we are ready to make amends in 2011/12.

Special thanks go out to Polly for all his help on match days as scorer and team manager. Your efforts don't go unnoticed and I really appreciate what you do. You are the best in the business and thank you for everything.

30 years ago (1980-81)

- New coach Bud Walder worked the players hard before the season with a big emphasis on fitness and concentration. Money was spent on a slips cradle and practice equipment trolley.
- Although attendance at training and social functions was the best it had been for many years the cricket report mentioned that a greater availability commitment to the club by all players, especially over the holiday period was required to ensure that early season wins can be capitalised on.
- For the 5th successive season the 2nd XI captained by Barrie Provan made the finals.
- This was the first season the club entered six senior sides.
- The highlight of the social calendar was the disco held at the Richmond Social Club.
- One of Balwyn's major sponsors for the year was Pyramid Building Society. It was later to collapse in spectacular fashion and cause much financial angst to investors and the town of Geelong.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT - PLAYING REPORTS

In what was by any standards an odd cricket season the number of weather impacted Saturdays saw a cricket fixture that bore little resemblance to the one that was posted at the seasons outset. The VSDCA in particular are to be commended for the flexibility they adopted in ensuring that the same amount of games were played if not in the configuration intended at the outset. As things stood it was not until Round 12 in late February that the creams were dusted off and the first and only two day game was played.

Despite the number of Saturdays missed through inclement weather, player availability was again a major issue that was of ongoing frustration when selecting sides or analysing results post game. Even allowing for injuries it should be a source of some embarrassment within the playing group that only 11 players played every game for the year. It cannot have anything other than a detrimental impact on the XI's we field when some players find it difficult to commit to playing, particularly those that play in the higher XI's. If we aspire to be a successful club then player commitment must naturally follow. This season we did not always meet those expectations and this should be an area we look to urgently turn around in 2011-12.

The 1st XI finished a somewhat disappointing 9th (8th in 2009-10) after commencing the year with four wins in the first five fixtures. At the outset it appeared they were well suited to one day games and in a year where they were to ultimately play eleven of them and an additional 20/20 fixture expectations were heightened. Unfortunately the victories invariably owed much to the powerful starts openers Ben Hanley and new arrival Nick Hailey provided and both were the leading contributors with the bat over the course of the season. Unfortunately they lacked the consistent support which had been a feature of the batting in 2009-10 and no other batsman exceeded 200 runs over the course of the season. Certainly the surfeit of one day fixtures was a contributing factor in lower outputs but hardly explain the five occasions when they were bowled out for under 130. Of the others with the bat Andrew Walpole in only his second season at the level fared well whilst Travis Miles, Ben McLeod and Patrick Tuohey all had their moments but would have yearned for greater numbers.

The bowling was arguably the stronger suit of the 1st XI and was rarely taken to despite appearing to have some deficiencies to cover from 2009-10. Despite some losses to the bowling this was somewhat offset with the return of a well performed, if not always available, Paul Janes. In addition Patrick Tuohey had his best season with the ball since the premiership year of 2005-06 and his luckless early season returns righted themselves after the break when he took 13 wickets in four games. Ben McLeod again provided a significant contribution and was particularly economical in the shorter format and Mitchell Carey on occasions showed how valuable his extra pace was.

Undoubtedly the highlights of the year were the contrasting run chase victories against Ivanhoe and Moorabbin. Other laudable victories included the early season comprehensive victories over Elsternwick and Plenty Valley. At their best they were able to compete deep in to games but unfortunately on a number occasions later in the season they were picked off a little too easily whilst still in the hunt for finals.

The 2nd XI under the leadership of Geoff Kiker (and occasionally Chris Wilks) was again expected to challenge strongly for finals and in a virtual carbon copy of the previous season fell away towards the end losing four of their five final games to finish 9th (7th in 2009-10). At the outset it appeared that the side were well suited to the shorter format games thrown up but as the season drew to a conclusion the bowling depth struggled and in particular losses to Malvern and Kew when defending 200 plus scores were pivotal. Ultimately however the final round capitulation to Brunswick when chasing 113 cruelled any finals hopes and was a disappointing end for a side had started the season so well.

The batting was lead by Trent Thomson who had an excellent all round year and certainly made strong claims for a return to 1st XI cricket. His run tally included a century against Caulfield. James Sheehan again improved and has turned himself in to a flexible and dependable member of this XI despite lacking some bigger innings that would have elevated his year further. Of the others Geoff Kiker and Guy Looker scored nearly 200 runs and got them in a positive manner.

The spread of wickets were fairly even with Trent Thomson and Daniel Kiely the leading wicket takers although Daniel was not always the most economical. Chris Wilks and Geoff Kiker were the best of the others. Importantly this XI saw young players such as Lachlan Fitzpatrick, Matthew Powell, Tristan Barlow, Daniel Clarke, Ashley and Tristan Harding all gain exposure to a more intense level of cricket for the first time which will be of long term benefit to the club.

The 3rd XI were again extremely competitive under the leadership of Bill Leropoulos and had an excellent early season run of wins which saw five consecutive victories from early November that virtually assured a finals berth well short of the seasons end. Unfortunately this was to culminate in a disappointing semi final result against Brunswick who were 7/49 in pursuit of 150 when rain unluckily intervened and this consigned

Balwyn to a 3rd placed finish (3rd in 2009-10). Years of consistently high finishes continue to throw up scenarios that include everything other than premierships.

At times the 3rd XI fielded strong sides and on other occasions cobbled together results with a patchwork of part time players as exemplified by a playing list of 50 players throughout the season. Importantly this did not greatly impact on results which reflected very credibly on the efforts of Bill in pulling this all together.

There were some significant performances over the course of the season with centuries to Troy Keyser and Guy Looker. Guy Looker scored 164 at better than run a ball against Plenty Valley and shared a partnership of 265 with Dominic Moloney in just 38 overs. Of the others Nick Courtney had his best all round season with the club and was consistent at the top of the order. Of the bowlers Bill Leropoulos was a consistent and economical wicket taker and Tristan Harding had an outstanding semi final haul of 6/22 to showcase his development over the course of the season.

Encouragingly younger players such as Daniel Clarke, Tristan Barlow and Vivek Ramjee were able to force their way into this side for the finals and showed excellent competitive instincts.

The 4th XI under the leadership of Jacob Jacob (and occasionally Michael Letcher) started the year in a promising manner winning three of their first four completed fixtures. Unfortunately this form line flattened out and coincided with dearth of availability throughout the senior XI's. As a consequence the side was not always a strong and competitive one as talent is invariably mixed across 41 players, and they incurred some heavy losses in the run home to finish 5th (Premiers in 2009-10). Strangely however a final round win would have been enough for a finals berth but for an improbable (and only) loss for the eventual premiers which elevated Coburg above Balwyn.

The batting in particular endured some less than flattering moments and the average per wicket was down nearly 10 runs on the previous years output. Michael Letcher and Jacob Jacob were the most regular, and as a consequence stand out players in this XI making excellent all round contributions and both should look to play higher in the coming seasons.

A feature of this XI was again the new players that were introduced to senior cricket for the first time and in some cases we had the added bonus of them playing with returning senior players who are parents of juniors also making the transition to senior cricket. It is to be hoped that Brendan Moore, Tony Johnson and James Houston can again find some weekends over 2011-12 to help out and offer some guidance to this group of players.

- The 1st XI had its most forgettable season ever finishing winless with Steve Leropoulos being awarded club champion and Bud Walder capturing a hat trick against Ivanhoe.
- The club tasted premiership success for the first time in 13 years with the 2nd XI (captained by Mark Gordon) and the 3rd XI (captained by Brendan Moore) prevailing. In an extraordinary course of events the 3rd XI finished the season outside of the finals before an error in percentage calculation was noticed. After this was corrected Balwyn (defending 75) dismissed Burnley in just under an hour before winning the Grand Final by over 200 runs. Current Honorary Auditor Tony Johnson took 11 wickets across both finals.
- Sponsored player caricatures greatly brightened the pavilion and raised approximately \$1280.
- Life member Colin Simpson achieved his 50th consecutive season of playing competitive cricket.
- The pre-eminent social function was Balwyn fest which was sponsored by Cascade breweries.
- The current hard wickets at the North-East corner of Balwyn Park were installed to assist with pre season, wet weather and junior training at a cost to the club of \$8500.

JUNIOR REPORTS

In season 2010-11 Balwyn continued its fine and proud tradition of giving the local youth an opportunity to have fun, develop their cricket skills, and play competitive cricket at an appropriate standard. Balwyn had sixty players registered this year and we fielded five teams in the Eastern Cricket Association (ECA): one Under 10, one Under 12, two Under 14s and one Under 16 team. The U 10s and U 12s play on a Saturday morning, and unfortunately rain played havoc this year, with six days lost to rain. The U 14s and U 16s play on Friday nights and fared much better, although the U 16 semi final was washed out.

Dan also played in the only senior side to play finals. Congratulations also go to Dom Greene who was awarded 4th XI Captain's award. It was particularly pleasing that nearly half of the elite Under 15 RM Hatch squad consisted Balwyn cricketers.
